with a kraft envelope, which she then used to build a dimensional, clustered embellishment. Her flair buttons created an eye-catching triangle in the center of the page that draws attention to her photos.

Ximber's journaling is tucked inside the kraft envelope located behind the final photo, making her page interact with the reader.

Mix and match patterned papers like a pro! BY KELLY GOREE

Our resident paper mixologist is here to help you break it down, cut it out and make it work.

I promise I'm not making a list and checking It twice, but if you have a stack of holiday patterned papers almost as tall as your tree, raise your hand high. Part of my problem is that December only comes around once a year and how in the world can I use up all the lovely prints I have so that I have room to buy more next year? With these few simple tricks, your seasonal papers needn't be confined to holiday layouts.

Look to the "B" side! Many manufacturers use a much more subtle print on the back sides of their holiday lines. This makes it much easier to mix and match with non-seasonal papers.

Cut it up! Don't be afraid to cut into those gorgeous papers. Use strips, circles, small squares or any shape you like. Even prints like music sheets and Christmas balls will look much different after being cut into strips or small sections.

Stir it up! Mix your holiday papers with neutral patterns or solid cardstock. This is a great way to introduce a colour that is outside the traditional holiday palette and expand the possibilities of your project ten-fold.

So what are you waiting for? Get those beautiful papers into your albums. It's a win-win! Your albums will have that holiday glow all year long AND you'll be able to put the newest collections on your Christmas wish list!

machine-stitching

Machine-stitching can be intimidating, even to the most seasoned scrapbooker, but have no fear! Nicole, our resident sewing expert, has some tips to help you conquer your sewing trepidations!

- → Make sure your sewing needle is sharp and thin. A size 9 or 10 works best.
- Using permanent or temporary adhesive, glue all of your layers together so they do not shift when you sew.
- When you have finished sewing on your page, turn it over and tape over the threads at the beginning and end of your stitching.
- Sew borders directly onto the trimmed paper pieces or embellishments before adhering them to your page.
- → A medium-length stitch works best to avoid tears in your paper.
- Try different thread colours for a fun, unique look.

Nicole created her school grade labels using a combination of stamping and mini stickers, and we loved the look!

Punch out 3 sizes
of circles, punching
the largest from
serap paper.



GPlace the largest circles onto your page and trace around each.



Layer (medium and small circles inside the traced circle. Sew down center as shown.



/Gently pull up on the top 3 layers of circles for a 3D effect.

faux-stitching

The easiest way to add the stitched look to a project is with a pen. With rows of small dashes you can frame in photos, underline journaling, accent embellishments and so much more.

Kelly faux-stitched concentric circles and created this eye-catching background pattern on her page. See below for a quick how-to and add this look to your next page.



fall y'all

We love how Xelly mixed up her pen details: by drawing some of her faux-stitches with a white gel pen.

faux-stitched circles: here's how

Punch out three circles in descending size. Using temporary adhesive, glue the largest circle to your project. Trace around the circle with a black pen using small dashes. Repeat with the medium and small circles.

Kelly says, "Try a white gel pen on dark paper for a unique look. My favourite is a Uni-ball Signo. It has the most opaque white ink and draws so smoothly!"





dies & templates

Coordinating metal dies and clear plastic sewing templates takes the guess work out of where to pierce your holes when hand-stitching. Sheri used a coordinating set by Stampin' Up! to create the hand-stitched hearts, which she misted with spray ink, on her page.

If your die design is open in the center, there is usually a metal margin of equal distance on the inside and outside of the die cutting line, giving you the perfect template to guide your piercing holes. After die cutting a shape, leave the paper inside the die and lightly trace around the inside edge. Remove it from the die and place the shape on a foam pad or mouse pad, then pierce a row of holes and erase the pencil line.

Many manufacturers make piercing tools, but a large needle or thumb tack work great, too.



Sheri placed the stitched hearts on her page using foam adhesive, which gives them the appearance of floating balloons.




templates & long stitches

Amy Tangerine has created a unique spin on plastic stitching templates by placing the piercing holes far apart. Not only do these stencils make quick work of the hand-stitching process, but the longer stitches work well to create more intricate shapes without having to sew too many stitches. These stencil kits come complete with a piercing tool, foam mat and embroidery thread.

To create your own stitching stencils, draw a design onto a piece of clear or frosted plastic acetate. Determine the length at which you want to space your stitches and pierce holes that distance apart. Start at the corners and intersections first, then fill in the remainder of the design. When going around tighter curves, place the holes closer together.



To backstitch, bring the needle up from behind at 1, then down at 2. Bring the needle up at 3,then down at 4. Continue to the end.



After stitching and trimming the feather and arrow pattern, Emily filled in a few of the open areas with patterned paper and glitter. What a fun touch!



The next time you find yourself heading to your cardstock stash, take a moment to consider an alternate foundation for your next page. Like Stephanie, Kimber and Nicole show us here, their backgrounds are anything but boring!



flying by the seat of our pants

patterned paper

Even though Stephanie has a lot of layering and dimension on her layout, the colourful patterned paper she chose for her foundation works well because she broke it up with a piece of solid, corrugated paper. Her base paper determined many of the colours she chose for the rest of her page, yet serves primarily as a source of accent colours in her overall design.


Stephanie began her journaling on the outside of the paper bag, then continued the story on a tag tucked into the sewn pocket—a great way to engage the reader!

die cuts

Die cut backgrounds are very trendy right now, offering scrapbookers a way to add low-profile dimension to their pages. Laura cut out her background circle pattern on an electronic die cutter and stapled it to a piece of white cardstock. Using staples allowed the die cut to "float" on her page, creating subtle shadows and added texture. Consider this option when attaching a variety of embellishments to your layout.

Laura's geometric background also served as a grid, allowing her to align the rest of the elements on her page. She finished off the design by adding enamel dots to the cut out centers of several of the circles.






Before attaching the background die cut, Laura misted the white cardstock with spray ink. elt toned down the brightness of the white and added subtle colour.





easy, detailed, expert

Whatever level of difficulty appeals to you, our easy, detailed, expert column has fantastic ideas to try today!

ere are days when I'd like to scrapbook but don't have much time to do so. Other days, I have the me needed to apply advanced techniques and add extra details to my projects. I hope to show you how adding just a few extras to a page can really make a difference in visual appeal. No matter what our style is, just a tweak here and there will let your personality shine through in your art.





picking apples

supplies CARDSTOC American Crafts; PATTERNED APER, Jillibean Soup, October Afternoon: STICKERS, Jillibean Soup, American Crafts; WASHI TAPE, My Mind's Eye, Freckled Fawn: PEARLS, Queen & Co.: STAPLES, Tim Holtz; PEN, Sharpie; PUNCH, Fiskars; ADHESIVE, Xyron

For my easy layout, I kept the design very basic. I started with a kraft cardstock foundation and added two blocks of patterned paper matted onto white cardstock. I then applied long strips of washi tape across the top, a row of punched circles and a few staples and pearls for accents. Rather than matting my photos onto white cardstock, I trimmed them 1/8" past the edge of the photo. I used foam adhesive on my journal spot to add some dimension to the page and a couple of small word stickers to reinforce the apple-picking theme.



For my detailed layout, I rounded the top corners of the white mat and added another strip of red washi tape. I shortened the "I" letters in the title and dotted them with red pearls. I also replaced the punched circles with a wood grain scallop border. I then tore the bottom edge of the lower wood grain paper piece and tucked a torn strip of red polka-dot paper behind it. Additional strips of patterned paper, attached with small staples, bisect the design. A speech bubble, attached with foam adhesive, and several more word stickers round out the page.

picking apples

For my expert layout I added some white spray mist to the kraft foundation. Using a combination of punched circles and white doilies, I created a border on the left side of the page. I replaced the sticker title with a die cut title, trimmed from vellum. Using small letter stickers, I spelled out the names of my children beside their photos. Finally, for added dimension, I wrapped twine around the center and tied it off in a bow

Marla's tips for game pages



- 66 After perusing all of the beautiful layouts in the Summer Reader's Gallery, it was difficult to choose just one! I was drawn to the unique design elements of Patricia Roebuck's layout and knew I wanted to scraplift them. 99
- X I really loved the layered flowers that Patricia created on her page. I replaced them with pie-shaped circles that I machine-sewed along the seams.
- X The scattered subtitles throughout Patricia's layout really caught my eye. To save time, I added pre-printed sentiments to mine.
- X I replicated the piece of tightly-woven chevron stripes across the top of Patricia's page with a larger, more bold chevron stripe. This piece determined the colour palette for the rest of my page.

- 1 Make a 4.25"x5.5" card base from black cardstock, with the opening on the bottom.
- 2 Trim a 4"x5.25" piece of wood grain patterned paper and adhere to center of card.
- 3 Trim a 3"x5.25" piece of orange patterned paper and notch the bottom as shown. Adhere to center of card, flush with top edge.
- 4 Trim a 4"x.5" strip of green paper and adhere horizontally, approximately .5" from the bottom edge of the card. Accent with a small piece of washi tape.
- 5 Die cut "EEK" from black cardstock and adhere above green strip.
- 6 Die cut spider web from black cardstock. Embellish ends of web with green baker's twine as shown. Adhere spider web piece to card using black and white washi tape.
- 7 Die cut a spider from black cardstock and adhere to the center of a canvas tag. Cut two lengths of jute string. Use one to tie a bow through the tag and the other to string the tag to the card. Hide loose ends of the jute behind the spider web.

- 3 Trim a .625"x5.5" strip of basket weave patterned paper and mat with ivory piece as shown. Zig-zag stitch across the seam.
- 4 Trim a .125"x5.5" piece of brown paper, a .25"x5.5" piece of green paper and a .625"x5.5" piece of basket weave patterned paper. Use these three pieces to mat the right edge of the ivory piece as shown. Adhere assembly to card front.
- 5 Die cut a 2.5" square sentiment panel from brown cardstock and a 3"x3" heart from orange patterned paper. Trim off the right edge of the heart and adhere both pieces to the card as shown.
- 6 Adhere a yellow button, tied off with ivory jute, to the bottom right corner of the card.

- 2 Trim a 4.25"x5.5" piece of ruler patterned paper, distress edges and adhere to card base.
- 3 Trim a 1.25" x5.5" strip of green patterned paper and adhere vertically to center of card as shown.
- 4 Adhere a 6.5" length of crochet trim over the green strip, wrapping and securing the ends to the back of the ruler paper panel.
- 5 Trim a 3.5"x4.5" piece from orange patterned paper, mat with ivory cardstock and adhere to center of card, using dimensional adhesive.
- 6 Trim a 2.25"x1" piece of yellow patterned paper and notch one end to create a banner. Adhere to bottom of orange piece as shown.
- 7 Round corners of the sentiment panel and adhere to card.
- 8 Adhere yellow button, tied off with jute string, to the top of the sentiment panel. Die cut a .75" brown leaf and attach to bottom of sentiment piece as shown.

happy halloween

- 1 Make a 4.25"x5.5" base from cream cardstock, with the opening on the bottom.
- 2 Trim a 4.125"x5.375" mat from white cardstock. Distress edges.
- 3 Trim a 3"x5.25" piece and a 1"x5.25" piece from neutral patterned paper and distress the edges. Adhere the larger piece to the left side of the white mat and the smaller piece to the right side as shown.
- 4 Adhere crochet tape over seam to cover. Wrap orange baker's twine around the crochet trim and tie off in a bow. Adhere assembly to card base.
- 5 Die cut a 4.25" scallop circle from black cardstock. Dry emboss. Trim off one-third of the circle and adhere remaining piece to the card, flush with the right side, using dimensional adhesive.
- 6 Die cut crows from black text paper and adhere to card with dimensional adhesive.
- 7 Stamp sentiment in lower left corner of card, using black ink.

many blessings

- 1 Make a 4.25"x5.5" card from kraft cardstock, with the opening on the bottom.
- 2 Trim a 4"x5.25" piece of wood grain patterned paper and distress edges. Mat with ivory cardstock and adhere to card base.
- 3 Trim a 2.5"x4.25" piece of coordinating patterned paper, distress edges, and adhere to card at an angle as shown.
- 4 Adhere a length of burlap ribbon horizontally along the bottom one-third of the card.
- 5 Trim a 2.5"x4.25" piece of notebook patterned paper. Die cut top edge with a notebook border. Stamp sentiment onto notebook piece, in the top right corner, using black ink. Using dimensional adhesive, adhere sentiment piece to card.
- 6 Adhere a length of crochet trim horizontally over the burlap ribbon and embellish with a button that has been tied off with jute string.
- 7 Die cut a vine from green cardstock. Die cut two pumpkins, one from green cardstock and the other from orange patterned paper. Cut the stem off the orange pumpkin and layer the remaining piece onto the green pumpkin. Adhere vine to pumpkin piece, then adhere assembly to the card, using dimensional adhesive.

- 5 When taking photos, go for a combination of candid and smile-for-the-camera shots.


idea 2: record differences

Approach documenting a challenging holiday or event in a new way, by highlighting what was different about it. In my case, I spent Thanksgiving alone with my parents for the first time in my life. In so many ways it was literally "a different view." Even though I was without my kids and there was no big family gathering, it was still very lovely and worthy of documenting.

I used this opportunity to record some of my favourite tastes and smells, emphasizing what I love about Thanksgiving with my parents. This was also a reminder to me that I have so many things to be thankful for, and these are the kinds of stories I want to include in my scrapbooks. What better time to document the things that we are thankful for than at Thanksgiving!

lavout ideas

- 1 Intentionally place your photos and journaling on a diagonal to emphasize the "different view" theme.
- 2 Use a die cutting machine to create a title and pop it up using foam dots.
- 3 Add embellishments in sets of three, and space them out around the layout. It's a nice way to create unity.
- 4 Think about ways you can visually express the theme of "a different view."

idea 3: imperfect life

In case you need permission, here it is: It's okay to document the imperfect pieces of our lives.

You may notice that I have told the real story of my Christmas Day without malice or blame. I don't see a place for that in my scrapbooks. With my words I acknowledge that this was a delicate Christmas for me, but then I bring it back to how excited I was to be with my kids again, how we celebrated, hugged, opened presents and made merry in our own new way.

It's very true that my kids will likely look back on this Christmas and not even be aware that there was any hint of sadness, but I want to remember how I felt. My approach is to simply state, "For me, it was a challenge in grace and a lesson in asserting what I need." Holidays after divorce are strange, uncomfortable, and challenging, no matter which character you play in the story.

It's also true that I could have created a layout that left out any trace of sadness and instead focused only on the joy I experienced in the later afternoon. I choose to include acknowledgement of what was real for me and then move forward.

Life is complicated, but each and every experience we have—good or bad, joyous or sad, uplifting or disappointing—shapes who we are. That is why I encourage you to document your authentic life, the highs and the lows and all of those moments in between that have made you who you are.

layout ideas

- Draw your own lines for journaling. Make them messy on purpose and then vary the size of your words and letters inside the lines.
- 2 Go bigger with the numbers you choose to add to you layout. I love emphasizing the date on many of my pages.
- 3 The original colour of my photo, taken with my phone, was really pink way too pink for my taste. Converting it to black and white in Photoshop before printing was a good way to fix the problem and it also added a timelessness to the photo.


