

Mix and match patterned papers like a prol by KELLY GOREE

Our resident paper mixologist is here to help you break it down, cut it out and make it work.

I'll admit to anyone who asks me that my true strapbooking love is patterned paper. Without shame, I confess to a large stash that I have been slowly trying to work my way through for many years, even as I collect more. Over time, I've noticed that the papers that seem to last the longest in my collection are the ones with large patterns. I love them, yet struggle to use them. And that got me to thinking, "I'll bet others have a hard time using them, too!"

So I decided to challenge myself to use up some of my favourites and share what I learned about taming large patterns. Just follow these few simple steps and you can master them, too!


Break it up. Cut into those patterns and make them smaller. Not only do they become more manageable, but you have more of the paper you love to use on future projects.

Cut it out. Don't be shy! Select your favourite section of the large pattern, then cut it out to use as an accent.

Make a frame. Structure can be one of the best ways use large (and multiple) patterns. By creating a frame around your project, the patterns won't seem busy or overwhelm the other elements on the page.

Now it's your turn! Find your favourite largepatterned paper and put it to work for you! It's as easy as 1-2-3!





spelling mistakes

There's nothing worse than completing a layout, only to notice that you have a typo in your journaling! Not only did Sheri come up with a quick fix for this mishap, but her repair became an additional design element on her pagel

To fix her mistakes, Sheri rewrote the words that she had misspelled onto a coordinating shade of cardstock. Then she simply trimmed out the words and glued the small pieces of paper over the misspelled words. It was an easy fix and gave more dimension and interest to her journaling spot.


-))) If you are short on time, simply reprint your entire journaling piece, trim it out and glue it over the old one.
- III Cover the journaling block with coordinating patterned paper and embellishments, then move the journaling to another area of the page.
-))) Cover the typo with a small label sticker, then hand-write the correct word over the top of the label.
-))) For a more humorous fix, leave the typo in place and write "oops" above it, along with a smiley face.

die cutting disaster

Technology has made its way into scrapbooking with the introduction of electronic die cutters, which make for endless creative possibilities. So, too, are the mistakes you will make until you master the learning curve of your device.


Emily designed this incredible title page in one inclusive file. After cutting it out, she realized that the top of one letter had cut into another, voiding each letter out. Rather than cutting the file again, she instead cut out one of the words from another colour of patterned paper. Emily then matted the word and placed it over the errant cut—a quick fix with a great, dimensional result!

Back filling negative cuts like papers



tips from emily

-))) Save the positive letters that pop out from your design. Not only can you use them to fix mistakes on your layout, but they can be used for other papercrafting projects, too.
- III Cover a cutting error with a label sticker, then add a chipboard alpha to replace the letter that was mis-cut.
- III Choose a shape sticker or chipboard element that closely resembles the errant letter and cover the mistake. For instance, a flower can replace the letter "O."

paper tear

We've all fallen victim to the dreaded paper tear when trying to remove a sticker from a page. The quickest fix would be to cut a new piece of paper, but Lynn ran out of the one she used. Not to be defeated, she put on her creative thinking cap and came up with a fabulous fix to cover up the tear.

With a bit of die cutting and paper engineering, Lynn came up with the top hat and moustache that frame the letter "S" of her title. Not only did it cover up the tear, but it also added a fantastic embellishment to this well-designed, all-boy page.

The white frame that Lynn preserved around each of her photos really makes then pop from the page!

-))) Cut a square of paper in the same colour or pattern as your title block, just large enough to cover your ripped paper. Place your letter sticker over the top for a subtle, tone-ontone cover-up to the tear.
- Place washi tape in a coordinating color or pattern over the tear on your paper. Then place your letter sticker over top. Your fix will look intentional and is a trendy way to emphasize the first letter in your title.
- Use chalk, mist, ink or markers to "camouflage" the tear, which will add an artistic touch to your page.





sewing snag

The idea of taking an almost-finished page and machine-sewing on it strikes fear in the hearts of many scrapbookers. From sewing crooked lines to jammed up bobbins, the blooper factor is quite high, but you muster the courage and lay needle to paper. Your sewing machine comes to a grinding halt and, in your valiant attempt to unjam it, you've managed to tear open a hole where a stitch once existed. What to do?

Christa has a few tips: "The fastest fix is to cover it up with an embellishment, like I did. But you can also trim a strip of paper to cover the former stitching line, then re-sew over the same area again. Journaling tags are another great way to cover up mistakes and give you a chance to write out your journaling before attaching the tag to the page." SCT



One of the fun things about hiding journaling on a layout is that it instantly makes your page interactive, inviting the reader to go in search of the story. We asked Kathy, Kimber and Kelly to conceal their journaling in a creative and clandestine way, and they came up with three very unique and different ideas. Read on for ideas on how you can add this fun and entertaining technique to your next layout!



100% silly

"pull here"


Using a slide technique, often seen in cardmaking, Kathy came up with a very engaging way to hide her journaling. Look closely at the chipboard camera and you'll see a small tab that says "look." With a tug on the tab, her journaling rolls out of the camera, revealing the story behind her photos. How inventivel


We love how Xathy directly applied a chipboard polaroid shape to one of her photos, instantly framing her two adorable subjects.

"tuck-away tags"

One of the quickest and easiest ways to hide journaling is on a tag, but don't let the simplicity of this idea diminish its creativity. Tags are especially useful when you have a lot to say, as several can be tucked into the same hidden area and pulled out, one at a time, to be read.

Kimber created her journaling tag by die cutting a label and stapling it to the top of a preprinted journaling card. The fill-in-the-blank card design was perfect for her to capture the memories of a day spent with her daughter. Kimber then tucked the tag assembly behind her photos for safe keeping.





To create the antennae and head on each of her butterflies, Ximber wrapped twine around the center of each body and tied it off in a knot.



s arDeltaook through the scrapbook pages that fill my albums, it is always interesting for me to realize how my style has grown and changed through the years. I have had periods of very simple scrapbooking to periods of very detailed work. This EDE project was so much fun to work on because I found joy in creating each layout, and there are bits and pieces that I love about each one. No matter what your style or abilities, scrapbooking is first and foremost about sharing a thought, a story or simply a special photo.





dreams into plans

For my easy layout, I focused on a simple colour-blocking design, with minimal embellishments and a large, focal photo. I created the base by matting an embossed piece of white cardstock onto a neutral sheet of kraft paper. I then cut out this great yellow quote card from a piece of Studio Calico patterned paper, which required no printing, die-cutting or writing on my part. I tucked two vellum hearts behind the title piece and embellished the page with a cup flower, topped with a button, and some ribbon and twine. I love how it was simple to create, yet still has a lot of visual interest and texture.



For my detailed layout, I wanted to incorporate some more advanced techniques so I created a cutting file in my Silhouette software and made my own title card. I die cut the word "anything" from contrasting cardstock and dotted the "i" with a brad. By adding some spray mist drops to the background, along with a few additional buttons and machine-sewn straight stitches, this layout went from easy to detailed in no time at all.

For my expert layout, I added additional layers of embossed cardstock, patterned paper, and a die-cut vellum doily. Small details, stamped with a neutral kraft ink, added more depth to the page. Here, I used tiny hearts and sentiments around the patterned papers. I pleated the yellow ribbon and added sewing on the diagonal striped paper for additional texture.





- 6 Adhere label sticker to heart and buttons to left side of card as shown.

- 6 Punch small holes in to heart and thread with baker's twine. Tie off the baker's twine in a bow.

- 5 Wrap white grosgrain ribbon around card and tie off in a bow on the left side.


