## **GETTING STARTED**

You don't need an actual album to make a mini album. I made mine from scratch by cutting most of the pages and cover from cardstock and patterned paper to 10 x 7 inches (other pages are  $10 \times 5$  inches). Add in envelopes and die cut shapes for even more whimsy, and then stack everything and stitch it together down the middle.

MAKE IT TIP: For less bulk, use fewer pages or wrap string around the entire album to keep it shut.

MAKE IT TIP: Make the cover reflect the vibe of the trip. Greece was super colourful, so the cover is bursting with

lots of saturated hues.



- MAKE IT TIP: Use machine stitching as a replacement for adhesive, to add texture, to create pockets, and to attach more papers to create interactive flaps and additional pages.
- MAKE IT TIP: Allow the photos to be the star of the show but have fun capturing the memories. The more embellishments you use, the chunkier your album will become making it more whimsical and imperfect, but that's half the fun, isn't it?

MAKE IT TIP: Include your kids in the project! Inside one of the flaps I stitched a paper pocket and asked my kids to colour me something about the trip. I cherish their contribution, and their artwork is now tucked inside the custom pocket.
