





step up your snapshots

Back to basics: composition. BY ELISHA SNOW

There are many tips and tricks to learn when it comes to knowing how to take fantastic photos. But knowing and practicing the very basics of photography composition can propel your talent and passion far beyond any other secret of the trade. Here are three basics of composition to get you started on the right track:




CAMERA SETTINGS: Canon 85mm f/1.8 lens; ISO 100: 1/800: f/1.8

understanding angles

When taking photos, it's natural to simply hold the camera up to eye level and snap the shot from where you're currently positioned. Instead, try shooting above, below, to the side, or behind your subject for a more creative outcome.

rule of thirds

To employ the Rule of Thirds, mentally divide your photo frame into thirds (both horizontally and vertically) with invisible lines. For best results, your subject should be placed at one of the four intersecting points where the lines cross. This results in a more dynamic and interesting photo every time!



CAMERA SETTINGS: Canon 85mm f/1.8 lens: ISO 100; 1/400; f/3.5

backgrounds

Always be aware of your background, keeping an eye out for distracting objects and colours. If there are distractions that can't easily be removed from the shot, try repositioning yourself or your subject. Also, the horizon line (another important background element) should remain as straight and level as possible.





Jennifer took to her scissors and created her own "die cuts." She fussy cut the globe, pencil, labels, and books from the journaling card patterned paper in this collection—brilliant!

tip: Punched and torn paper strips can take a basic design to the head of the class by adding texture and a decorative edge to pieces that would otherwise be straight and narrow.

For a fun twist on this already cute pencil journaling card, Emily cut around the pencil shape and popped it

up with foam adhesive. Using 3D adhesive is a quick way to give any flat element added emphasis and prominence.

typ: The vintage-inspired flashcards and blackboard motif immediately took Emily back to her grade school days. If products ever remind you of your youth, seize the day and take the opportunity to tell your own stories of days gone by. Your family will be glad you did.

Seeking an embellishment option that would add some texture, Sheri took a DIY approach. She covered wood veneer pieces with the washi tape strips to create flower centers and cut leaves from the burlap trim to complete

her bloom. An A+ in agriculture and creativity go to this girl!

tip: Journaling cards often include inspiring sentiments. If you don't have the space for a full 6 x 4 journaling card, simply trim the statement in strips and adhere them to the page.



project: trend

A report on the latest trend-setting products hitting the scrapbook runway (and scrapbook stores). This issue: string art. BY VICKI BOUTIN



I fondly remember creating art with nails and thread as a little girl; weaving a variety of fun patterns on wood boards. This was an art form known as string art and, my friends... it's back! Whether it's a great welcome sign made from intricately arranged threads, a twine-wrapped monogram, or a Spirograph-themed greeting card, projects made with twine are winding up everywhere. Take a look at ways you can incorporate this blast-from-the-past trend into a few fun paper projects.

tip: When designing using twine and brads, simple patterns work best. Brads are short and don't leave room for much wrapping.

STRING FLING TECHNIQUE: Brad & Twine Weaving

You don't need wood, nails, and yarn to create a groovy string art design. Instead, try paper, brads, and baker's twine to achieve this look on a layout.

this girl

supplies CARDSTOCK: Bazzill Basics; PATTERNED PAPER, CHIPBOARD, DIE CUT SHAPES, STICKERS: Simple Stories; ENAMEL DOTS: Queen & Co., Simple Stories; ADHESIVE: Scrapbook Adhesives by 3L.

STRING FLING TECHNIQUE:

Twine-Covered Wire Word

Add texture to your wire creations using string. Simply wrap large-gauge jewelry wire with twine and bend the wrapped wire into a shape or word.

hi

supplies CARDSTOCK: Bazzill Basics; PATTERNED PAPER, DIE CUT SHAPES: BoBunny; STICKER: Simple Stories; PAPER CLIP: Doodlebug Design; ENAMEL DOTS: My Mind's Eye; STAPLER, STAPLES: Advantus; ADHESIVE: Scrapbook Adhesives by 3L; OTHER: Twine, wire.

STEP ONE: Adhere end of twine to back of punched or die cut scalloped circle using tape. Pull the twine around to the front between two scallops.



STRING FLING TECHNIQUE: Spirelli String Art

Wrap string or twine around a scalloped shape to create a trendy and touchable embellishment. To vary the look, try leaving different amounts of space between each wrap from one scallop to the next.

tip: This technique uses plenty of string, don't cut your piece too short.

thank you

supplies CARDSTOCK: Bazzill Basics, Doodlebug Design; PATTERNED PAPER: Crate Paper; TWINE: Doodlebug Design, The Twinery; GEMS: Queen & Co.; STAMPS: Ali Edwards; INK: Ranger Industries; PUNCHES: EK Success; ADHESIVE: Scrapbook Adhesives by 3L; OTHER: Buttons.



STEP TWO: Count a set amount of scallops and wrap your twine around to the back of the scallop. Bring it back to the front, positioning the twine between the next set of scallops. Count the same number of scallops (in this case, eight) and wrap around back again.



STEP THREE:

Continue wrapping until the twine rests in the spaces between each scallop twice. Once complete, adhere twine to the back of scalloped circle; secure in place with tape.

Alter Chipboard

Chipboard books are a fun album option because they're sturdy and come in cute shapes (like this house design by Maya Road). To dress up those bare pages, use patterned paper. Laura used a page from her album as a tracing template to paper the walls of her mini home. To attach paper to chipboard, try a liquid adhesive or glue stick.

tip: When gluing, remember to smooth out any air bubbles by rubbing from the center of your adhered paper, outward.



Next, insert your pie filling (confetti, paper, words, etc.). Fuse to seal your pie and add a flair center to complete the design.







This works especially well with black and white photos.







tip: Line up your photos on an imaginary horizontal plane. Here, two photos are above that line and two photos and an embellishment are below it. It offers an instant sense of order to a design.









Whether you're looking for a simple page design you can create when you're short on time or desire more advanced techniques to try, this column has something for you. BY AMY HELLER

My goal with every layout is to keep my photo(s) at the heart of my design. This can be done by simply backing images with journaling cards for quick photo mats or creating interesting paper placement that guides the eye to my images. It all depends on the time I have. Here are a few tips (some quick and easy; others more involved) for designing pages that highlight your favourite snapshots.



easy

this is the one

I wanted to keep my approach on this page simple, so I decided to back my photos with journaling cards. These cute cards are already designed, cut, and measured to fit, making scrapping quick and easy. I also opted for a design with plenty of white space, which allows my photos to remain the focus of my story.

ideas to fit your time schedule



detailed

To increase the difficulty and creativefactor, I replaced my pre-made journaling cards with strips of patterned paper, which I cut and positioned in an ombre fashion. Cutting strips may take a bit of time, but it's time well spent! Using darker colours on the edges and softer colours in towards the center is an effective way to guide the eye to the focal area of your page.

Sometimes a little artistic play is in order. Sure, it can take more time, but it can also be very enjoyable. Wanting to bring some of that fun into my Expert design, I backed my die cut title with a watercolour wash. I also replaced the straight patterned paper strips with paper weaving. This adds texture and interest while keeping the attention on my images, and it does so in a more playful fashion.

typ: For added texture, add torn strips of vellum and washi tape.

creative card techniques

Heat things up with embossing.

BY JENNIFER MCGUIRE

Like a magic trick, heat embossing offers that WOW factor every time. Watching the heat cause the embossing powder to melt and solidify right before your eyes never gets old! What you may not know is there are many wonderful embossing techniques beyond basic heat setting. As the weather cools outside, let's warm things up inside with tips for stepping up this versatile technique.

card 1

COLOUR GRADIENT HEAT EMBOSSING

Heat emboss using various shades of blended powder to create a colourful ombre look.

- 1 Stamp star background onto black notecard using embossing ink.
- 2 Apply red embossing powder to the bottom of the stamped image. Slightly above where the red ends, use your fingers to sprinkle a tiny amount of orange powder.
- 3 Apply orange embossing powder over the red (the colours will blend where they overlap) and to the center area above the red section. Slightly above where the orange ends, use your fingers to sprinkle a tiny amount of yellow powder.
- 4 Apply yellow embossing powder over the remaining area, including the overlap with the orange. Remove excess powder.
- 5 Set embossing powder using a heat tool.
- 6 Stamp balloons and monkey with black ink and colour using markers.
- 7 Colour the eyes and add balloon strings using a black pen. Add highlights using a white pen.
- 8 Stamp greeting.
- Assemble card.

card 2

WATERCOLOUR RESIST EMBOSSING

You don't need watercolour paints to achieve a watercoloured look. Instead, try pairing dye ink and water with a heat embossed image to create a striking emboss resist/watercolour effect. Here's the skinny on creating this calming look on your next card:

- 1 Stamp leaves on watercolour paper using embossing ink, apply white embossing powder, and set using a heat tool.
- 2 Generously apply three shades of green water-based ink over the embossed area.
- 3 Spray inked area with a mix of water and Perfect Pearls to blend the ink. This will create a watercolour effect. NOTE: The embossing will resist the moisture and ink, while the pigment powder will leave a shine.
- 4 Let the card dry, and then buff using a cloth.
- 5 Trim and mat the watercoloured piece and adhere it to a green card base.
- 6 Adhere "hello" die cut to card and cover with a layer of dimensional glaze.

LAYERED EMBOSSING

Create interesting texture and depth by layering your embossing. This works particularly well using stamps that are designed to be layered, such as this Christmas tree. Here's how to emboss three unique layers and complete this card.

- 1 Create stamped and embossed tree piece following the Layered Embossing directions on the next page.
- 2 Ink around embossed piece (from Step 1) and add gold enamel dots.
- Stamp background image on kraft card base using white ink.
- Out strips to fit width of card from blue and white cardstock.
- 6 Heat emboss the sentiment on white cardstock using gold embossing powder.
- 6 Adhere blue strip, embossed circle element, and white embossed sentiment to the card.

STEP ONE: Die cut circle from blue cardstock. Stamp base tree image using embossing ink, apply dark green embossing powder, and tip to remove excess powder.



STEP TWO: Set embossing powder using a heat tool.



STEP THREE: Wipe embossed area with an anti-static sheet, such as an Embossing Buddy (shown here).



STEP FOUR: Stamp second tree layer using embossing ink.



STEP FIVE: Apply light green embossing powder and heat set. Wipe area with an anti-static sheet.



STEP SIX: Stamp third layer of tree using embossing ink, apply white embossing powder, and heat set.



STOM Spark

What have you recently said goodbye to in your own life (by choice or not)? A person? A place? A job? A piece of furniture? Tell the story of one of these experiences or combine multiple examples into a list to tell a single story along this common theme.





As we enter this, the last quarter of the year, and transition to a new season, let us document the things we'd like to let go (or have already let go of this year). Recording these events and feelings is a wonderful opportunity for reflection. These are the stories that round out the birthdays, holidays, and other annual occurrences. These are the stories that help make our scrapbooks real and authentic and from the heart.

There's beauty in saying goodbye—in moving forward from people, or thoughts, or things that just aren't working. There's power in acknowledging the things we've outgrown. Sometimes, as the case may be, it's wishing others well who choose to leave us. Such is life. And documenting and celebrating this natural process lends an even richer personal voice to our projects.



layout 1

ideas to note

- How do you let go? Document your methods for winding down (or up, as my case may be). For this layout, I told the story of a weekend where I "let go" with a little help from Las Vegas.
- 2 This is the kind of photo that many people would discard. It's a bit blurry and there's a lot going on with not much of a focal point. But I love it because it shows me in action —hands in the air—letting go via dancing and singing. If you have a similar photo that is less than perfect, consider adjusting it to black and white using photo editing software. I took this approach with my image, toning down the crazy colours from an indoor evening shot, and I love the results.
- 3 As usual, I focused on three embellishment areas. This creates a visual triangle around the page: a chipboard heart accent + a large title (this time a plastic word) + a chipboard banner leading into my journaling. This is a great way to guide the eye to the areas of most importance on your design.
- 4 To easily frame your layout, add strips of the same patterned paper to the top and bottom of the page.



layout 2

ideas to note

- What have you learned about letting go? Share your knowledge with those you love (especially your children) in the form of a letter. Letters are an excellent way to pass along information, values, ideas, etc. In this letter, I simply state some of the things I've come to know about letting go—things I think might be of value to Anna in one way or another as she gets older. It's communication and storytelling and documenting all rolled into one.
- 2 Create a stamped border by placing a piece of cardstock over your printed journaling, leaving an even margin exposed. Stamp repeatedly in the exposed margin and then remove your cardstock mask to reveal your frame. Using a date stamp is a clever way to date your heartfelt note.

3 When working with two full-page elements, such as a photo and a letter, create a connection between the two independent items by using common embellishments. Here, I've used the same letters and stars to unite the two pages.

- What are you working on letting go of in your own life? Odds are it's more than one thing at any given time. Capture your own list(s) using journaling cards, which you can carry with you and add to as thoughts come to mind.
- 2 To understand the deeper meaning behind saying farewell, I used the prompt "let go of ______ to make room for _____." I find this to be a positive approach to this topic, as it shows that new things are always on their way in.
- Remember, you don't have to include photos to tell a meaningful story. Sometimes the story has a greater impact when it's told with just your words. For a quick approach to this style of scrapbooking, use my free, printable Let Go journaling cards and a divided page protector.






clean & simple

Strong balance is the foundation of any great layout. Let's explore the two key approaches you can take to create beautifully balanced designs. BY CATHY ZIELSKE

When people ask me how they can best improve their layouts, I tell them the same thing: focus on creating beautifully balanced pages. Symmetry and asymmetry provide direction for putting your images and words onto a page in a balanced manner. Let's look at each.



tip: Have you documented your hobbies or obsessions? As I get older, my 15 and 19-year-olds are less excited to be my scrap subjects so I've had to look to other places for my inspiration. Luckily, there are many ways I can document my life, including sharing my hobbies. It's a fun subject and offers a bit about me and my interests at this stage in life.

layout 1

SYMMETRICAL BALANCE

Symmetry occurs when you have elements and spaces of equal value across a given space. Think of it like this: one side mirrors the other. It doesn't mean you have to use identical elements, but the spaces your words and images are occupying should be roughly the same.

The placement of my photos on this layout is symmetrical and the base that everything else is designed around. The photos are grounded with a white cardstock mat and a 1-inch frame of patterned paper.

Symmetry communicates stability, predictability, and an overall calmness to any design. When the brain sees the inherent logic of a symmetrical design it says, "Yes, this makes sense."

Symmetry can drive the design process, as well. When you know you have a series of square photos, for example, you can place some at the top and some at the bottom. Suddenly, creating a brilliant layout just got a whole lot easier!

layout 2

ASYMMETRICAL BALANCE

Asymmetry occurs when you have elements and spaces of differing values across a given space. Think of it like this: what you have on one side, you don't repeat on the other. With this approach, working with white space can be a playful and unpredictable design experience.

Asymmetry doesn't mean you throw stuff on a page at random. Here, I've created a gathering of overlapping photos on the right and paired that with a title and journaling on the left. These elements are not mirror images and yet the placement, complete with the white space above and below the title, creates a space that feels balanced.

Asymmetry communicates energy, surprise, and motion to a design. When the brain sees an asymmetrical design, it's more challenged and engaged as it works to figure out the visual connections.

- 2 Increase your canvas size to 2 x 2 inches. Go to Image > Resize > Canvas Size. Anchor your canvas in the center and choose White as the Canvas Extension Color.
- 3 Create a new document (8.5 x 11 or 6 x 4). Copy your mini photo (Select > All, Edit > Copy) and Paste (Edit > Paste) into the new document.
- 4 Add a stroke to the photo to serve as a trim guide. Go to Layer > Layer Style > Style Settings... and check the Stroke box. Add "1 px" as the size. Click OK and you will see an outline around the photo. Repeat for each photo.
- 5 Print your sheet of mini photos and trim each just inside the line.

While you're at it, design a striking stained glass look using alcohol markers. Yes, these tricks will open those creative curtains to new cardmaking tricks as they shine a light on your imagination.

card 1

A vellum-wrapped card base creates the foundation of this semi-transparent window.

- 1 Cut 4¼ x 5½ panel from orange cardstock.
- 2 Cut 4¼ x 6 panel from vellum. Score ½ inch from the top. Adhere flap to orange panel.
- 3 Die cut circle frame. Adhere to vellum.
- 4 Die cut large circle. Adhere to front of card. Add letter stickers.
- 6 Cut circle frame from patterned paper. Randomly adhere circles to card.
- 6 Add gems, sequins, and enamel dots.

- 3 Add a strip of striped paper to the inside of the card.
- 4 Die cut photo frame. Adhere to front of card. Stamp sentiment.
- 5 Stamp lamp shades on orange cardstock. Die cut.
- 6 Die cut lamp bases from kraft cardstock.
- Assemble lamps. Adhere one light inside the card. Adhere second to the outside.
- 8 Add string and enamel dot to the lamp on the outside of the card.



- Die cut tree circle from cardstock and circle from vellum. Adhere together.
- ② Die cut circle ring from black cardstock. (To create a ring, set a large circle die on cardstock and then cut a smaller circle out of it.) You'll want to do this with craft foam too.
- 3 Adhere the tree to the rings.
- Flip tree over. Use markers to colour the backside of the vellum. When you're done you'll have a stained glass window.
- 5 Cut a square from white cardstock. Emboss, round corners, and adhere to black cardstock.
- 6 Round the corners of a card cut from black cardstock. Cut panel of white cardstock to fit on card, round corners, and adhere to card.
- Add tree and square to card.
- Stamp sentiment. Add black gems or enamel dots.
